St. Andrew's Children's Clinic is a 501(c)(3) non-denominational, non-profit organization whose mission is to provide free medical treatment for disabled children of impoverished parents from Mexico, using medical and lay volunteers from both sides of the border. It is a unique international expression of compassion and caring and brings health healing and hope to the children and their families. The Clinic was founded in 1973 by concerned individuals in Nogales, Arizona and Nogales, Mexico. It is the longest running border health project in the U.S. The children we care for have a variety of serious medical problems, including cerebral palsy, orthopedic, vision, speech and hearing conditions, often requiring surgery and extended care. The Clinic is held the first Thursday of each month (except July) and treats 200-300 children each Clinic day.

***Who is eligible for services?***

Anyone who is homeless, stranded, or in need of a place to stay and who satisfies the State's income requirement.

***How long can someone stay at the Shelter?*** All guests who stay at the Shelter more than two days will be seen by a Case Manager who will determine with the guest the preferred length of stay. Typically, guests stay approximately 1 - 4 weeks. Some guests have stayed longer based on their needs and circumstances. If needed, guests enrolled in our Life Change Program may have an extended stay.

***What is included in a stay at the Emergency Shelter?*** Guests staying at the Shelter sleep in a comfortable bed, receive warm meals, a hot shower and an opportunity to rest. Separate facilities exist for men, women, and women with children. The Shelter is open from 24 hours per day, except Sunday mornings from 8am - 12pm while staff and guests are attending church.

***What other assistance is available?***

The Mission's Case Manager makes referrals to other agencies when needed, and along with guests develop attainable, custom designed goals and plans to accomplish the goals.

Living Hope Women's Center of the White Mountains is a Christian ministry dedicated to the sanctity of human life, the belief in abstinence until marriage and the teaching of sound Christian precepts of life-style and parenting.

It is an opportunity for Christians to reach out in love to pregnant young women and single mothers and assist them emotionally, spiritually and physically. In the process Christ's message of love and redemption will be seen as well as heard.

It is also an opportunity for Christians who are pro-life to put actions to their convictions. Young women who are in crisis pregnancies need to know the truth about abortion before they choose. It is our goal to influence a woman's choice of **LIFE** for her unborn baby and to come along side her in practical, tangible ways throughout her pregnancy, delivery and afterwards.

## *White Mountain Meals on Wheels*

The mission of Meals on Wheels – Show Low is to provide nutritious meals containing at least 1/3 of the recommended daily dietary allowance for the elderly and disabled of the White Mountain area. These meals are delivered five days a week.

Each meal is hot and delivered for the noon meal. On average, eighty meals are delivered Monday through Friday.

The service of Meals on Wheels not only provides a hot meals for the client, but also provides that client with human contact, someone to say hello to – and receive the act of human kindness through the drivers who deliver these meals.

The geographical area is large, covering the towns of Show Low, Pinteop/Lakesie and the outlying areas. We have three drivers, each driver coers an average of 43 miles per day. A fourth driver is needed to help split up the routes.

White Mountain Meals on Wheels program is the ONLY agency serving meals to the elderly and homebound.

White Mountain Meals on Wheels services are available to the elderly and disabled regardless of age, country of origin, disability, ethnicity, familial status, gender, religion, religious beliefs, or sexual orientation.

Through the LWR Handcraft Project, you can enjoy beautiful Fair Trade handcrafts and improve the lives of artisans around the world at the same time. More than one billion people live on less than \$1 a day; another 2.7 billion struggle on less than \$2 a day. And income inequality is increasing around the world. Globally, nearly 200 million people are unemployed, while millions more are underemployed and don't have enough work or income to support their families.

More than ever, women are entering the labor force, often as the head of household and sole income earner. They are less likely than men to find normal employment and are often paid less for comparable work— in fact, the majority of the world's working poor are women.

When employment is scarce or wages are too low, children suffer the most. They may have to work long hours in fields or factories to help support the family rather than attend school. Families without reliable income can't provide sufficient and nutritious food or access basic health care, both of which negatively affect their children's health and development
